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ANTI-BRIBERY & CORRUPTION

This course explains the four offences that can be committed under The Bribery Act. It looks at the fine line between gifts and bribes – when is it acceptable to give a gift or hospitality? And when might they be seen as a bribe?

It also explains what you should look out for – the signs that suggest that bribery might be taking place. It looks at what you should do if you've been given, offered or promised a gift or hospitality and think it might be a bribe, or if you suspect someone else is involved in bribery.



UK Bribery Act 2010 guidance

1. Introduction

We explain that your organisation has a procedure in place for reporting suspected bribery and that this defines who to report such issues to. We then outline the importance of the UK Bribery Act.

2. Definitions

Putting the terminology in simple terms and explaining the meanings behind them, specifically; bribery, bribe and corruption.

3. The Bribery Act 2010

The Bribery Act 2010 creates a new offence under section 7 which can be committed by commercial organisations which fail to prevent persons associated with them from bribing another person on their behalf.

4. Gifts & Hospitality

Corporate hospitality and gifts are not criminalised by the Bribery Act 2010, but clearly gifts and hospitality are vulnerable to being used as bribes. Here we highlight considerations before offering or accepting any gifts or hospitality.

5. Multiple Choice Assessment
